Make a compliments card for someone in your class. You can sign it if you wish. Bring it in and surprise them with your kind words.	Practise having a simple conversation in French with someone at home. Try to use: Bonjour Je m'appelle... Ca va? bien/comme ci comme ca/ ca va mal	Go on a tiling hunt in the house or on a trip out (with an adult) take a picture of the tiled pattern or see if you can re-create it by drawing. Mosaics are a nice example of tiling too.	Go for an Autumn walk around your home and write down the names of objects you see for each letter of the alphabet. i.e. a-apple tree, b-bark, etc.	Ask someone at home to give you some sentences. See if you can up-level these sentences by adding more exciting 'wow' adjectives. (Maybe you could add more exciting connectives, openers and punctuation too).
Try and read at least two books at home this term. Write a book review for each and bring them in to share with the class.	Design a shape picture. Use lots of different shapes to create a picture.
