Make a compliments card for someone in your class. You can sign it if you wish. Bring it in and surprise them with your kind words.	Find examples of tessellation (tiling patterns) around your home or out and about. Display these in any way (photos, drawing, description, etc)	Research an area that interests you about The Human Body. Bring in your research to share with the class.	Go for an Autumn walk and write down the names of objects you see for each letter of the alphabet. i.e. a- apple tree, b-bark, etc.	Ask someone at home to give you some sentences.
