



Home learning activities linked to the work we are covering this term.

<u>Health & Wellbeing - emotional</u> Make a friendship card for someone in your class. You can sign it if you wish. Explain why you think they are a good friend. Bring it in and surprise them with your kind words.	<u>French</u> Practise saying the months of the year. Maybe you could even make them into a song! janvier,fevrier,mars,avril, mai,juin,juillet,aout, septembre,octobre, novembre,decembre.	<u>Maths - measure</u> Use a ruler or measuring tape to estimate (good guess) and measure the length of objects around the house. You can use non-standard units too (E.G. how many hands long?)	<u>Topic</u> Choose something about the forces and electricity topic that interests you. Use your ICT skills to research some more information about this. Remember to ask an adult first and think about internet safety.	<u>Health & Wellbeing – P.E.</u> Can you find more opportunities to walk each week? For example walk to the local shop instead of taking the car.
<u>Literacy – reading</u> Use the novel you are reading at home to ask an adult some <u>open</u> and <u>closed</u> questions.	<u>HWB- food science</u> Try to taste some new food. Give the new food a mark out of 10. How many new things can you try?	<u>Primary 3 Home Learning January-March 2020</u> Here are some activities you may like to do at home this term. You can do them at any time and in any order.	<u>Art and Design</u> Can you create a poster providing useful information about what to do in an emergency?	<u>Health & Wellbeing- social</u> Next time you are out in your local area can you spot where the local emergency services are? (police, fire station etc.)
<u>Numeracy</u> Think of a creative way to practise your 4 times tables. For example, you could draw a picture to illustrate... $4 \times 5 = 20$ (draw 4 groups of 5 cupcakes).	<u>Literacy – listening & talking.</u> Can you ask an adult at home if you can help with the cooking? Remember to listen to all of the instructions and ask questions if you are stuck.	<u>Responsible Citizens</u> Take on a new responsibility at home. You may even interview someone at home to find out how you are getting on!	<u>Literacy - writing</u> Can you write a letter to a friend or family member using the correct layout, you could even post it!	<u>Numeracy</u> Can you ask an adult to write down some subtraction sums? You can use concrete materials to help.
