Revise how to simplify fractions by dividing by the lowest common multiple. E.g. $20/30 = 2/3$ as 20 and 30 both divide by 10.	Go onto “What’s my Angle?” on Top Marks and practise making and measuring angles.	Practise your spelling words by putting them into sentences with as many WOW words and high level openers as you can!	Log on to Borrow Box using GLOW, or by downloading the app on a phone or tablet/iPad. Select an eBook or Audio book to enjoy.	Revise the punctuation of direct speech. Create a conversation between you and another person with the correct punctuation.
Ask an adult or an older sibling to create or download some multi step numeracy word problems for you to complete.	Research a natural disaster such as the 2004 tsunami.
