



Additional Home Learning Activities for Primary 4

These activities can be used on an ongoing basis to help your child practise key skills.

Remember your child's main learning tasks will be set through Microsoft Teams

<u>Spelling</u> Forest Phonics https://ictgames.com/mobilePage/forestPhonics/index.html Choose a sound to practise.	<u>P.E</u> <u>Indoors</u> https://cosmickids.com/video/sonic-the-hedgehog/ <u>Outdoors</u> Make up a fitness sequence to try out in your garden.	<u>Writing</u> Super Short Story – write a story that only has 50 words. Your story must still have a clear beginning, middle and end. Remember capital letters and full stops.	<u>Music</u> Musical Sensations: blindfold 1 person, the other plays different types of music to the blindfolded person. After each piece of music, the blindfolded person discusses how the music made them feel and what sensations they felt in their body.	<u>Reading</u> Find a cosy spot and read a book with a family member. You can choose one online too. https://www.getepic.com/ https://www.oxfordowl.co.uk/
<u>Health & Wellbeing</u> Kids at the table – next time you are preparing to sit at the table to eat, ask if you can set the table to include everyone. You might want to make place cards for where people have to sit! Or what about a menu card for everyone and glasses for different drinks?	<u>STEM</u> Make the tallest tower you can that stands by itself and is not attached to anything.	<u>Primary 4</u> <u>Home Learning Activities</u> Here are some activities you can choose from. You don't need to do them all! You can share your work on Teams and/or Twitter.	<u>Maths</u> Time – work on time durations, can you show o'clock, quarter past, half past and quarter to on a clock? Play this game to practice. https://mathsframe.co.uk/en/resources/resource/116/telling-the-time	<u>Art</u> Find something circular to draw around. Create lots of circles on any type of paper and fill with any type of pattern you like. You can add colour if you want.
<u>Numeracy</u> Countdown – play this game with another person. One person writes down a 3-digit 'total' number. The other person writes down 4 numbers between 1 and 10 as well as 3 numbers which are multiples of 10, up to 10. For example, Total: 432 Numbers: 4, 7, 9, 3, 20, 70, 50 Set a 2 minute timer and work out the total number by using the other numbers and any of the 4 operations. The person closest to the total wins.	<u>Listening & Talking</u> Share and discuss your artwork with someone at home.	<u>RME</u> https://youtu.be/h8QHHjIL80w Watch the Woo in the Woods video. Why was Jamie so kind to all the animals he met? How can you help wildlife or adults at home?	<u>IDL</u> Can you make a fact file with words and pictures to show what you have learned in your topic?	<u>Emotion Works</u> Draw a head and a body on a piece of paper. Decorate it so that it looks like you. Think about the following emotions: happy, sad, angry, anxious, excited. Draw where you might feel these on your body.
