Design an object that might help promote sustainability. Use recyclable resources to create a 3-D prototype. Create notes to explain how this device might work. Share this idea with the class!	Research 3 species being affected by plastic pollution in the oceans. Can you think of any solutions to save each of these animals? Record your ideas in a creative way!	Use your knowledge about co-ordinates to create a game and challenge someone at home! (Maybe you already have the game 'Battleships' at home or could use a digital version!)	Go for a Spring walk with an adult around your home or community. Take a bag with you and collect any litter that has been discarded.	Ask someone at home to give you some sentences. See if you can up-level these sentences by using synonyms and interesting wow words. (Maybe you could add high level openers, connectives and punctuation too).
Try and read at least two new books at home this term. Remember these can be any length or genre! Write a book review, or record a podcast with someone at home to discuss the books!	Create a scavenger hunt for someone at home. Use your knowledge of directional language to write clues or instructions for them. Are there any jobs you could do to maintain or develop the outside space?	Take on a new responsibility at home. You may even interview someone at home to find out how you are getting on!	Go on a metalinguistic hunt for tricky words in some of the books you have at home. Bring them in and see if you can use them in your writing.	Research any songs that will help you revise your times tables! Focus on the 7, 8 and 9 times table. Share these with an adult at home or the class!
